7. All entries must be checked out and released by the respective department superintendent between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Saturday, August 18. A claim check is required. No responsibility is assumed for exhibits not picked up by the deadline.
8. Persons who may exhibit at the Bosque Farms Fair are:
 - A. All boys & girls active in Bosque Farms 4-H Club..
 - B. Residents or owners of property in the Village of Bosque Farms or nearby communities as outlined on the Boundary Map. (Note: Rodeo, Foot Races, and Horse Show are all open to anyone who wishes to enter.)
 - C. Any merchant who makes a cash or merchandise donation to the fair is invited to set up a commercial display in the designated area. (\$5 refundable clean-up deposit & fair board approval required.)

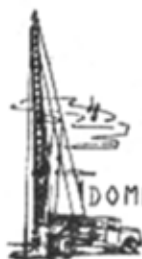

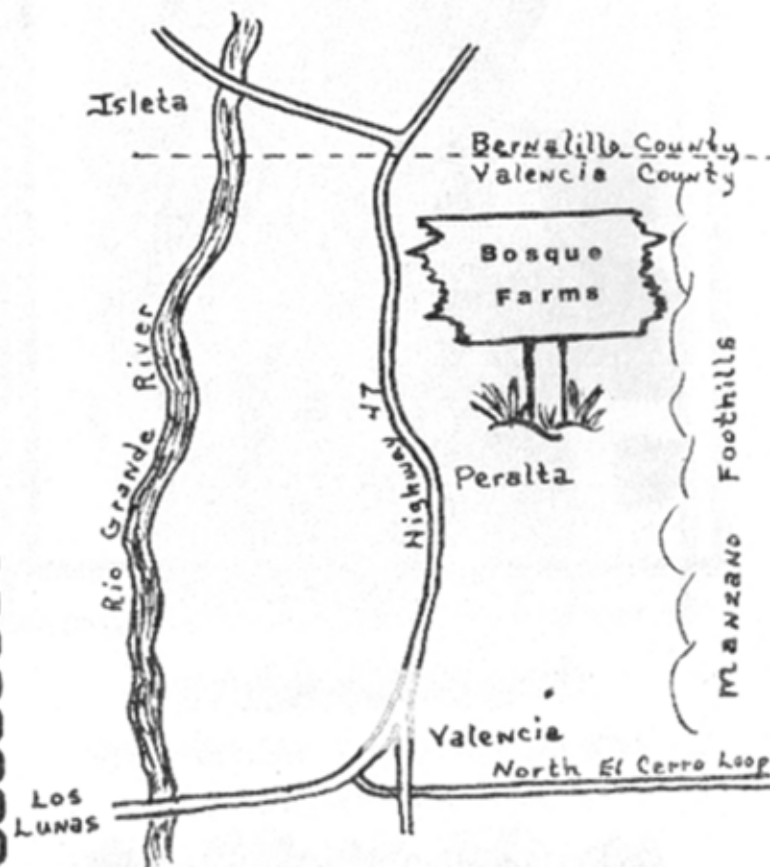

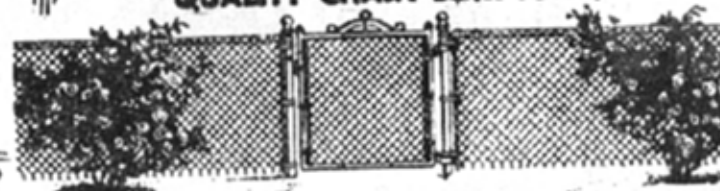

BOSQUE FARMS FAIR By Mrs. Chester Carpenter

The Bosque Farms Fair was organized in the Summer of 1939 and was sponsored by the Extension Club of Bosque Farms for several years. For the first few years the Fair was held on Labor Day.

The first Fair in 1939 opened bright and early with the vast sum of \$14.11 cash.

After much planning it was decided the Extension Club would sponsor the refreshment stand. Mr. and Mrs. Sig McKinzie consented to be in charge of arrangements for the stand.

Even though they were very busy all day they entered several things in the Fair, winning several Blue and Red ribbons — along with Champion flower arrangement.

The races for the children created a lot of enthusiasm because of the cash prizes for the winners. First place was fifty cents, Second place twenty-five cents, and Third place was ten cents. The money for the prizes was the profit made from the Extension Club Booth.

The first race of the day was a tiny tot race and each person who entered received five cents even though some did not leave the starting line.

The second race was a "hot race" for everyone had to have a toad to enter. (Toads were scarce for weeks after the Fair.) Each toad was marked on his back with a number and the child who entered it received a like number. A circle of about 10 feet across was marked off and at the starting whistle the toads were all dumped out of a bucket in the center of the ring. There was a lot of calling and excitement, for the first toad to hop out of the circle won a dollar for his owner.

There were various races held through out the day. Even the women threw the rolling pin and drove nails. There were foot races for the fat women as well as skinny ones.

When the money ran out we would call a rest for ten minutes so that people could go to the refreshment stand to spend their winnings on pop, etc. In this way there was money again with which to run more races.

After the prizes were paid on the Fair exhibits and expenses for the "Stand" were settled, we had \$7.50 for a start on the next Fair.

As the years went on we had a "Beauty Contest" with Ann Noble being the First Beauty Queen. In 1942 a pre-school "Better Baby" show was held with almost every child in this age group being entered. Robert Morrison was the first contest winner.

Our motto in 1939 was "Bigger and Better." We have enjoyed twenty-five years of "Basket Dinners" and renewing old friendships.

BOSQUE FARMS RODEO ASSOCIATION By Joe Hobbs

The Bosque Farms Fair began in 1939 as a community get-together and picnic. As time went on interest grew in exhibits such as livestock, sewing, canning, and produce. To handle these exhibits the Bosque Farms Fair Board was formed.

For entertainment at these get-togethers there was various foot races and horse races. Some farmers exhibited their teams and much pride was taken in these horses at that time.

A group of men took it upon themselves to oversee these various events. As time went on an interest grew in rodeoing, these men, each year before the fair, would build a temporary chute for calf roping. After having to rebuild these temporary chutes each year for several years, it was decided that a Rodeo Association should be formed and permanent chutes and arena built. Thus in 1953 the Bosque Farms Rodeo Association was organized. The first members were Wayman Shore, Ward Hobbs, L. P. Bloodworth Jr., and Bob Fulgham.

6. Animals will be received between 5:30 a.m. and 7:30 a.m. Saturday, August. Only pre-registered animals will be accepted.
7. Judging will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. Saturday. No one, except superintendents, is permitted within 25 feet of the judges during livestock judging, except when exhibitors are required to show their animals.
8. All entries must be checked out and released by the respective department superintendent between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Saturday. No responsibility is assumed for exhibits not picked up by deadline.
